Celebrating the Years

Foothills' 70th Anniversary

On Thursday, December 5th (2-4pm), the Foothills Art Association will celebrate its 70 years in the community with a holiday potluck, volunteer appreciation, and a fundraising art sale. Mark your calendar to celebrate this special event at the Foothills Gallery. Donate your extra and unused art supplies or other novelty items to the fundraising sale. You can drop-off these at the gallery any time before the event. Then, come enjoy our celebration and shop for a special holiday gift or two.

The Foothills Art Association has a long history of promoting art in our community. Foothills was founded in the summer of 1949 when Cora B. Payson, who was chairman of the art department of the La Mesa Women's Club, asked the club to sponsor an art guild. That resulted in a meeting of seventy interested, art-minded people at the club house on October 19, 1949. The Women's Club sponsored the new art organization for its first year providing rent-free space for meetings, exhibits, and other activities.

Over the years, the Foothills Art Association has promoted fine arts in a variety of ways. Our membership has grown to over 150 artists whose work is displayed in changing monthly shows at the gallery. Both our annual juried "Membership Show" in April and a judged "Small Image Show" in October (*continued on page 7*)

A Reflection of My Love for Nature

My oil paintings are a reflection of my love for nature—God’s creation and handiwork. The sheer beauty of nature becomes me to capture its ever-changing moods on canvas. Such views as a soft meadow on a spring morning, a silhouette of trees at dusk or a meandering garden pathway draw me to interpret them in paint. Although I have worked in other mediums including pastel, colored pencil, and charcoal, I now prefer to work exclusively in oil. The “feel” of applying paint to the canvas, the freedom of blendability, its texture and luster all contribute to the allure of oil paint. Working in stages and layers of application allow for the effects that I desire.

Traditional realism to impressionism represent my painting styles. Though largely self-taught, I have been influenced greatly by studying works of the Old Masters and the American Impressionists. Visiting the Louvre in Paris, the Hermitage in Russia and other gallery/museums in Europe and the United States has contributed to my artistic growth.

Although I create the majority of my works in my studio, I have come to appreciate the spontaneity of plein-air painting in recent years. I strive to convey a sense of beauty, sensitivity and serenity in my interpretation of nature, being pleased when others sense these feelings in my paintings. Bringing happiness to others through my work and teaching is a source of joy to me. Painting has opened a new world to me and art has become an integral part of my life. I paint because I can’t imagine not painting!

Sandra Hayen’s artwork has been displayed in numerous publications including Southwest Art Magazine, Art-Talk, and the East County Californian. She has taught at Grossmont Adult Education, Helix Adult Center, College Avenue Community Adult Center, and in private oil painting classes in Coronado and Lemon Grove. Her work has been shown at the San Diego Museum of Art Festival of Fine Arts, the San Diego Hospice, Mission Trails Regional Park, and at the Foothills Gallery. She is a member of the Oil Painters of America, California Art Club, San Diego Museum of Art Artists Guild, and the Foothills Art Association.

Our 30th Annual Wildlife in Art Show



This year's Wildlife in Art Show was another wonderful success. FAA President, Scott Trimlett, spearheaded a complete renovation of the gallery to celebrate our organization's 70th anniversary and the show's 30th anniversary. With support from Rusty Holec, and Lee Atkinson, everything that was previously painted burnt orange, as well as the vertical window panels, now have a fresh coat of silver-gray paint. The two 45-degree panels in the back gallery were painted coconut gray. Finally, all walls were given a scrub and touched up with wall white paint and the baseboards were given a new coat of the same paint. Jeanne Rechtfertig

and Debbie Atkinson gave the gallery a final shine to floors, windows, kitchen, and the restroom.

The reception, as always, was well attended and enjoyed by all. Thanks to our members for bringing the usual fine array of tasty treats. Also, thanks the FAA board, a wonderful selection of appetizers from Cupid's Catering was served as well as a delicious cake from Claim Jumper. What a great feast.

Lee Kromschroeder, this year's jurist, was really impressed with the high quality of the art entered and did a great job selecting the top pieces for the show from the 100 entries submitted by 55 artists. All totaled, 19 award ribbons were presented, representing over \$2,600 in cash and merchandise awards. We thank Lee for selecting a nicely balanced show, reflecting diversity in both subject matter and media.
