February Demonstrating Artist

Susan Binford

Susan Binford who will be the demonstrating artist at the Foothills February 6th meeting (2-4 pm) tells us, “I am a San Diego artist who discovered my unique style through experimentation and hard work. My purpose as an artist is not to imitate nature but to reveal a deeper connection to our natural world. I work in various media including oil, acrylic, and watercolor. Frequently I use textures to add dimension to my works.”

Susan began painting over 20 years ago and has had instruction by prominent artists including William DeShazo, Carol Cottone, Reed Cardwell, and Pia Stern. She is noted for her use of textures and for her experimental approach to painting.

During her demonstration, Susan will be doing a technique she calls base underpainting using a base painting in acrylic that creates a cracking in the surface.

Message from the Chair...

Yay! We've progressed into the new year. What a nice jumpstart we had in January with Gabriel Stockton as our demonstrating guest artist in January. His demo at our members meeting was fully packed. He shared his thoughts and methods behind his preferred 'en plein aire' watercolor works. After Gabriel plans his subject and composition, he starts putting it to paper with a quick and loose sketch by holding a 2B or 4B pencil at the back end (like a drummer's drumstick) to lay things out on rough 140 lb (though his preferred is 300 lb) Arches or similar paper. When the overall layout is ready, he draws in some details by holding the pencil closer to the point for control. Then, it's time for doing his light watercolor washes on the paper, filling in bigger sections, then onto the smaller sections. His approach is to go from the lightest values paint mixes then onto gradually darker, being careful not to overwork a given area, adding layers of a mix of color values into somewhat still damp areas to allow the magic of watercolors to take on their inherent color and value play. It was apparent that Gabriel finds both peace and energy in his passion and enjoyment of creating masterful plein aire artwork scenes. During his demo, he did a quick sketchbook value and composition color study of our inviting Porter Hall Gallery, and then he moved to carry out his planned study scene onto a sheet of 140 lb paper. What a fun afternoon it was, with so much being covered and shared with us... Thank you Gabriel!

Our annual holiday fundraising sale was a big success in December. Thank you for making your generous donations of surplus artwork supplies, frames and equipment (the tables were full). I hope you found some great bargains to take advantage of.

Do limber up your brush because in the next few months we have a lot on the calendar. In February, we have the "Old Masters" show coming up. I always look forward to this show, it is so much fun! Carrying on with our new tradition tradition,
