March Demonstrating Artist

Craig Anderson

Craig Anderson is excited about the opportunity to be the demonstrating artist at the Foothills Art Association. In both his demonstration at the Members Meeting on March 7th (7:00 pm) and at his follow-up workshop on March 23rd, he will stress how to push the value in watercolor paintings in order to increase the power and dramatic effect of the finished piece.

Craig believes that art is a timeless expression of the beauty that surrounds us. He views artwork as a fossil of some piece of real life (a real, living, breathing thing) that has existed in time and space. He works exclusively in transparent watercolor. His trademark is his unique use of vibrant color and bold value patterns which allow him to discover and reveal the majesty hidden within his subjects.

Born and raised in upstate New York, Craig moved to San Diego in 1988. He is an award-winning artist whose work is

Message from the Chair...

For me, it's all of you who join in all of our festivities and activities; at our members meetings, our featured artist receptions, our guest artist's workshops and other special events during the year. We are a wonderful and helpful collection of like-minded artists and art enthusiasts who enjoy and are enriched by each other's company. As you might imagine, I thoroughly enjoy seeing and chatting with all of you. By now, you probably also know I do cherish my time with my grandkids; and speaking of eight, our brood of kiddos will be growing by one more in July. Yippee!

Besides our rug-rats, there are others in my life that I really treasure... especially the wise and knowledgeable friends who are my senior (20 years or more). Many are also members of Foothills. They greet each day as an opportunity to explore and create their art and they have much to share with us. We are blessed to have them. One good friend of mine, Rolf, is turning 90 years-old this year. I painted a portrait of him (*shown below*) as a surprise! But, shhh...his birthday is in April, so let's keep it a secret.

This talk of seniority reminds me that we (the Foothills Art Association) are turning 70 this year. Can you believe it? We have promoted and provided art education since 1949. We will need to mark this milestone in some very special way.

Our February members meeting with Linda Mullen was so much fun. We had a packed house (over 50 attending) for her watercolor demonstration. She showed us (1) layout/composition steps she takes in creating her works, (2) the paint brands and colors she uses in giving her whites in floral petals just the right amount of color blushing (sharing her various color schemes storyboard with us), and (3) the beginnings of the many layered glazing applications she applies in creating her better than life artworks. She uses only Arches 140 lb. cold press paper, and she prefers a good sable brush (to hold the water/paint) and also uses a blended sable brush and at times a synthetic brush. She uses Winsor, Lukas, Daniel Smith and Mission paints, and she explained how she selects the one needed for the right attribute. Linda then provided us with her "About Paint" information sheet showing which paint colors are transparent or translucent and staining versus (*continued on page 6*)

Let's Discuss Painting
Preparing for Disaster
by Robert Milberg



Robert Milberg, a long-time member of the Foothills Art Association, served as president from 2004 to 2006. A few years ago, he moved to Paradise, California where he personally experienced the devastation of the Paradise Fire.

As an artist and a total-loss victim of the fire in Paradise, California, I thought I might share a few thoughts. Prepare now! In a disaster you may only have minutes to get out. Think about what you cannot live without.

Have pictures of your artwork and know its value. Make sure that you know what your insurance policy says, what it covers and what it doesn't. Since most insurance companies require you to make an inventory of your "stuff," start now and video every drawer, cupboard, nook and cranny of your home and garage so that you know what you have.

I had hundreds of brushes and art supplies, and some I can't replace. When a disaster strikes, you are not in the mental state to be able to remember everything. Your insurance company (it is not your friend, it is now all business) is betting on you not remembering. So inventory now.

On an up note, and I'm pretty excited, I recently got into a nice gallery in Park City, Utah.

The 2018 Paradise Fire, also known as the Camp Fire, was the state's most deadly and destructive fire with 86 fatalities and 18,804 buildings destroyed. San Diego has also experienced devastating wildfires: the 2003 Cedar burned 273,246 acres killed 15 people and destroyed 2,820 structures; the 2007 Witch-Guejito-Poomacha Complex Fire burned 197,990 acres, destroyed 1,852 structures; the 2007 Harris Fire burned 90,440 acres killing eight people and destroying 546 structures; the 2017 Lilac Fire burned 4100 acres destroying 157 buildings and killing 46 horses at the San Luis Rey Equine Training Center in Bonsall.
