

## **Duke Windsor**

Duke Windsor is a man of many interests and many skills. Born in Texarkana, Texas, Duke served in the U.S. Marine Corps as a combat illustrator and drill instructor. He subsequently studied classical voice at San Diego State University, later performing with the San Diego Opera Chorus. He has also been a freelance illustrator, an amateur rodeo rider, a martial arts instructor, and a singer-song writer and guitar player. In addition, he is an extraordinary artist.

Duke's "Urbanscapes" have been exhibited and received awards at juried exhibitions, group shows and corporate venues in San Diego and Southern California, and they are held in many private collections throughout the U.S. and Europe.

Duke is an Associate Artist member of the California Art Club, Oil Painters of America, International Acrylic Painters Association, San Diego Watercolor Society, and Foothills Art Association.

## Message from the Chair...

As you may know, I was saddled with a cold/flu bug for a few weeks. So, I missed seeing all of you at our March Members Meeting, but I was with you in spirit. I know that all went perfectly well in my absence with our wonderful group of volunteers (my super heroines and heroes) who make our group the best in town. Please give Rustin Holec a big pat on the back next time you see him for jumping up and being our master of ceremonies on the night of our members meeting.

Rustin let me know that we were fortunate indeed to be treated to Risë Parberry's "Sedimental Journey" demonstration (and I'm signed up for her workshop). During her demo, Risë interestingly used plastic baby food containers for prepping her granulating paints and noted that she loves to take advantage of verticals, chunky bits that appear when brushing on (even occasional hair that may fall into the mix). Her tips included using an absorbent, clean paper towel wrapped around a roll of toilet paper to absorb water from the brush; you want to make it lightly damp so it will granulate. She also advised us to repeatedly wipe the surface under your painting while it is drying. She further displayed getting cool effects through spraying water, tipping, shaking, and letting it move about. Her motto for artists in the midst of creating their works: "Don't worry about it, just enjoy it." Thinking of Risë's good motto, I have the following thought to share with you as a fellow artist:

*As artists, some of us are starting out, some are masters  
and most of us somewhere between. But remember,  
the passion and joy we give and receive in creating our works  
is the best reward to all of us.*

I did get to drop by the gallery to see our Expanded Media (almost anything goes...) Show. Many artists pulled out all the stops and restraints in their entries. The result was a show of fantastic and wild artistic creations and beautiful wall hanging sculptures. Now though, remember it is not time to relax because in April we have the Annual Members Juried Show. And, as always, we thank you all for sharing your artwork with us in the gallery.

I hope you had the wonderful experience of viewing the expressive contemporary works of Linda Morton and Geri Dorfí, our duo Featured Artists at the Gallery in March. I acknowledge and thank Judy Sawyer for arranging our continuing schedule of featured artists whose works beautifully adorn our gallery walls each month.

## Helix High Art Students Featured at the Gallery



For many years, the Foothills Art Association, in accord with its mission “...to promote the advancement of fine arts in the community...” has provided an annual monetary donation to the art department at Helix Charter High School. Last year, Foothills invited the art students of Helix High to be the “featured artists” at the gallery. This year, once again, Foothills will feature the students’ artwork during the month of April.

Tina Colera, director of the Helix High Art Department who has taught there for 19 years, says, “We are a charter school that has a lottery so that kids can come from all over San Diego. We recently

moved into remodeled rooms and love it! We usually participate in a district show at Parkway Plaza every year and are really looking forward to showing our work at the Foothills Gallery.”

The course work for the student in the Helix High art program includes the elements of design and its application to art creation, art history, and theory. Students explore multiple art media and learn to plan, propose, produce, and critique artwork from stills, models, and from their imagination. They evaluate art media and critique other artist’s and fellow students’ works. They build their portfolio and investigate possible art college options.

Tina, who is a member of Foothills, has expressed appreciation for the support that Foothills has offered to the Helix High program. She says that she has found collaboration in the community to be extremely rewarding for her students and she looks forward to “art adventures” with Foothills.
