May Demonstrating Artist

***Andrea Rushing***

At an early age, the drawings of Andrea Rushing showed promise and caught the praise and encouragement of his parents and of a family friend who gifted him with materials and advice. Born in Virginia in 1960, he was, by the age of fourteen, painting in acrylics. In both execution and subject matter, his work was considerably more sophisticated than his years. Then, by his own choice, Rushing left college, and painting, for a stint in the Navy and, after that, in the defense industry. It was this detour that broadened Rushing's perspective and provided a great catalyst for change: he learned, traveled, let the world educate him, and then finally came to understand that painting was his future.

Rushing returned to creative work, studied at the Academy of Art in San Francisco and, for the first time, found himself around other artists and people who thought and felt as he did. As his painting increased so did his recognition: he has had one man shows at San Diego State University, San Marcos State University, and at the San Diego Museum of Art. Currently, his work hangs in the Michael J. Wolf Gallery in San Diego, and in the Heritage Art Gallery and the Reginald Ingraham Gallery in Los Angeles. Most recently, he had a mural hung in the Price Center at UCSD.

## Duke Windsor



The Foothills Art Association is pleased to feature the artwork of Duke Windsor at its gallery during the month of May. His extensive life experience and sensitivity to his surroundings give his work a unique presence of place.

Born in Texarkana, Texas, Duke served in the U.S. Marine Corps as a combat illustrator and drill instructor. He subsequently studied classical voice at San Diego State University, later performing with the San Diego Opera Chorus.

An avid practitioner of the martial arts, Duke owned and operated a martial arts studio for seven years, eventually achieving the rank of *4th Dan Black Belt*.

Duke's urbanscapes have been exhibited and received awards at juried exhibitions, group shows and corporate venues in San Diego and Southern California, and they are held in many private collections throughout the U.S. and Europe.

Duke is an Associate Artist member of the California Art Club, Oil Painters of America, International Acrylic Painters Association, San Diego Watercolor Society, and Foothills Art Association. He is former Education Chair of the San Diego Museum of Art Artist Guild and has also served as a member of the Public Arts Selection Committee of the San Diego Regional Airport Authority Art Program. Duke is a highly sought-after art educator who has taught art to both adults and children at numerous venues, and he has juried many local and regional art exhibitions. He currently teaches drawing and oil painting at Art on 30<sup>th</sup> in North Park and is a workshop instructor with the La Jolla Athenaeum.

At its lightest, Rushing’s work suggests Magritte, showing life in an amused juxtaposition; at its most intense, it alludes to Dali or Rousseau, where man and image confront each other in unnerving contrast. Rushing’s great power as a painter lies in his insights into human nature — sometimes as in studies of rich symbolism, and other times in straightforward portraiture where his brushwork reveals the sitter’s truth and destiny. And, always things are rendered with compassion and elegance.

“I never call myself an artist,” says Rushing. “I am a painter. I don’t wait for inspiration; I just do the work. There are so many things that can derail creativity. That’s why criticism or praise are equally dangerous, and why ultimately it’s useless. My only job is to continue to mature as an artist, learning how to paint freely and paint comfortably. But it will always be just one step at a time. A painting is like a construction. For example, a chair: it needs to be comfortable; it needs to be functional; and it needs to be beautiful. But, it’s a built thing, and if it’s done well it will stand up. Paintings, I think, are the same. Let's Discuss Painting  
"Take Five" by Bob Pinner



*Bob Pinner's "Take Five" was a unique mixed-media piece shown in the "Expanded Media Show" on display at the gallery in March. Those who saw the piece understand how the interactive engagement of visual and audio stimuli plus personal memory created a new satisfying experience. Below is Bob's description of this very creative piece and its concept.*

"Take Five" - This multimedia piece is composed of five parts: a motion detector which turns on the piece; an Arduino mini-computer which controls the action; LED lights which flash in time to the music; an Mp3 player with a memory card to hold the musical file; and finally, the painting.

The concept of "five" is repeated throughout the piece from the title of the tune, the 5/4 timing of the tune, the pentagon shape of the piece, the five characters in the painting who are "taking five", and the five pentagons within the painting. "Take Five" is a 1959 historic composition by Paul Desmond and Dave Brubeck.

*Bob said that he spent a lot of time on the piece and even needed tech consultants. He has now completed another piece featuring Jimi Hendrix's "All Along the Watchtower," that is on display in the April Juried show at the gallery. He says that the template that he used can now be applied to any music, "a little sister" of the music video genre.*
