I enjoy the fellowship of my fellow artists who feel the same enchantment of this beauty around us. My paintings are impressionistic, and I continue to strive to perfect this technique with each day the Lord gives me.”

Have you traveled to do plein air painting? If not, I would recommend it. I traveled last weekend to the Bay Area to paint. Oh wait! It wasn't really plein air painting. It was just "plein condo" painting. But, I still had a good time helping my daughter and her hubby get their condo ready for sale. And, I also got to hold and hug my grandbabies over the weekend, so, how much better could a trip be? But, I still think I'd enjoy travelling to paint plein air. And, I expect that maybe you would, too.

Will you be participating in our "Art in the Park" show and sale event on Sunday, June 10<sup>th</sup>? It will be a fantastic gathering of our wonderful local artists who will be exhibiting and selling their artwork. So, invite your friends and family for a great day of picnicking, lounging, and enjoying art on the grassy hills of La Mesa's MacArthur Park.

At our last meeting, Kevin Pack had us in awe showing technics and materials he uses in painting his incredibly detailed and explicitly rendered wildlife masterpieces. Kevin explained that the key for his success was mastering drawing skills before ever touching a paintbrush (and that took him a year or two to accomplish). The lessons he learned from his close mentoring relationships with other accomplished wildlife artists, and his ever-growing experience, shows in his incredible works of art. He explained that it can take 20 layers of glazing colors to capture the depth and feel of the water in his scenes of a stream trout fighting a line. He treats each pebble in a scene as a separate painting. The results are alluring wildlife scenes. During his demo, we picked up many helpful tips, one being his use of a granulation medium to capture and display the fine details of sand and rock. At his follow-up workshop, Kevin offered direct, friendly comments and guidance to participants. What a great opportunity and experience it was.

We are pleased to welcome Edward (Eddie) Juarez as our guest artist for the June demo and follow-up workshop. An amazing, local, life-long artist, Eddie does both plein air scenes around San Diego and colorful, expressive works of art. His demo will be a treat for us all. Come for the fun, and sign up for his workshop (*see page 5 for details*).

I hope you see Sharon Thomas' beautiful, varied, colorful artwork featured at the gallery through June 6<sup>th</sup>. Beginning on June 8<sup>th</sup>, we are pleased to feature the artwork of Michelle Rachels. I've enjoyed her entries in our monthly shows and look forward to seeing her collection of work. “I have always been drawn to the native inhabitants of our beautiful planet. To me, they are the diamonds of the Earth,” says Michelle Rachels. Her artwork has focused on indigenous cultures and wildlife, seeing them as being true to their specific region, environment, and culture.

“My paintings,” says Michelle, “are traditional and representational with a twist. With today's more minimalist lines, a splash of organic wood with the subject at hand, makes for an interesting compliment. Besides, in today's busy digital age, don't we need to be more grounded and reminded of our natural world? Creating on wood is exciting because of the range of different effects that you can achieve. Sometimes, I carve out the soft grain. Other times, I will leave the grains unpainted so they become an integral component of the finished piece.

“I have painted with oils pretty much all my life. No college degree, but, did attend San Francisco Art Academy on a scholarship one summer, Cal Arts briefly, and Laguna Beach School of Art, before their tragic fire. Armen Gasparian, a well noted artist of Laguna Beach, took me under his wing. He once said to me ‘Michelle, whatever you do, never stop painting.’ Well, life happens and painting was placed on the “back burner” for decades. I traveled the world, raised a beautiful family, and have been truly blessed!” And now, many of Michelle’s paintings have been sold and are in private collections around the world. The painting shown above, “Three Black Necked Cranes of Napi Wetlands, China,” was sold to Ricky Ho, an award winning, popular Singapore composer.

AGENDA TOPICS

- a. Mandy has Kevin Pack set as our guest artist for our May members' meeting on May 3<sup>rd</sup>. In the months following, Duke Windsor, Carol McClure and Gene Locklear are scheduled. To optimize attendance and participation, workshops will be scheduled at least a week later than the demo night. Workshops will be a minimum of two hours in duration.
- b. Sharon Thomas is our Featured Artist for May. Michelle Rachels will be our Featured Artist in June and will hold her reception on Sunday, June 10<sup>th</sup>. Kathleen A. McLaughlin, Nora Curran, Nonita Degen, and Racquel Gabuy have been juried in and scheduled for future months.
- c. We will have our formal elections for our Board Officers during the May 3<sup>rd</sup> general meeting. Linda has prepped a list of the nominees and sent it to all of our members. The changes reflected in the list show Gary Dyak for 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President, Midge Hyde for Recording Secretary, and Roberta Labastida for Corresponding Secretary.
- d. Annual membership dues will be due soon, and Linda has revised the renewal form with an "Enhanced" membership option at \$40.00. This option allows members to display 14 photos of their artwork and a contact information page on the Gallery website.
- e. Lee and Debbie Atkinson had 4 people attend a volunteer orientation at the April general meeting. Carol will explore the ability to add a "Wildlife in Art" link to our website.
- f. Artists registration is now open for Art in the Park. Scott Trimlett can be contacted by email ([ffht13@gmail.com](mailto:ffht13@gmail.com)) to arrange for registration, payment of the participation fee and sign off on the waiver form for the city of La Mesa. Scott will also be available at our FAA Gallery on Saturday, May 26 (11am to 4pm) and Tuesday May 29 (11am to 4pm.) On June 10<sup>th</sup>, check-in and set up will be from 8:30 to 11a.m. The event will be from 11a.m.-4p.m. and take down is from 4-5p.m. Roz's husband has designed a Banner for our Art in the Park event. Gary and Linda designed and had Art in the Park business cards printed for distribution. Linda has also prepared a Public Service Announcement to send to all the media contacts. The event will be promoted as a family picnic and art in the park. Mandy will purchase balloons for the entry.
- g. Our members at the April general meeting voted and approved the proposed change to our Bylaws as follows: "All officers shall be elected annually. Officers shall be eligible for re-election for multiple years of service. However, if an unanticipated need should arise, any such elected Officer may resign or be removed from office, with or without cause, by vote of the majority of the members present at any regular meeting during which such need has been raised for member consideration." Linda will update the digital version of our Bylaws to incorporate the above wording and share it with our Board and Committee members.
- h. The possibility of the East County Art Association combining with the Foothill Art Association into a single organization was tabled for future discussion.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:13 am.
