Dear fellow Foothills artists,

It's such a pleasure to share some recent artworks with you; I love the dialogue we have at Porter Hall as we view each other's creations! I enjoy painting with acrylics and tend to concentrate on nature and landscapes with occasional portraits and man-made objects. Recently, I have been thrilled by fall scenery on driving trips to Colorado where my daughters live. I got really lucky this year hitting some peak colors in late September. You will see some of those fall colors in my works this month. I usually use photos as references, often using several as guidance for a single piece. A painting in the exhibit references a stream my daughter shot, elk we saw on one trip, and mountains on yet another. I am self-taught and each painting teaches me something new. My son, who is a pro artist for the Hollywood movie industry, helps critique my work in progress and says to me "make it tell a story dad..." I've been doing several train paintings lately and at first my train was passing through peaceful sunlight along a river – not exciting. So I changed it to be leaving the sunlight and entering into a dark forest - trying to build suspense. It was so much better and it sold quickly! I will continue to try mature artistically and hopefully hit upon some good stories to tell along the way!

The Foothills Art Association Board meeting convened via Zoom meeting on Monday November 8th, 2021 at 10:00a.m.

Attendees: Scott Trimlett, Gary Dyak, Bob Pinner, Judy Sawyer, Lee Atkinson and Roberta Labastida.

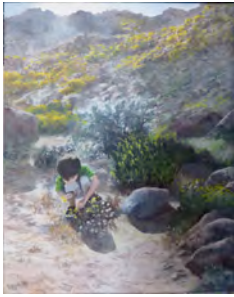
1. Sandra Hayen passed away on October 30th. Her family is looking for a venue to sell her artwork. Scott will make some inquiries into possible places.
2. Our December Holiday Meeting will include food, raffle prizes and our annual Holiday Art Supplies Surplus fundraising sale. A memo will be sent out in the near future. Glenn let Scott know that the San Pasqual Winery will donate 3 bottles of wine to put in a package to raffle off ;0)
3. Wildlife In Art - 81 juried art works were delivered and checked-in to our Gallery. The Hanging Committee displayed all the artwork in preparation for Tom Tiedeman to judge the exhibit. All Tribute, Business Group and Personal Sponsor awards were awarded on Monday November 1st. The award prizes totaled \$2425.00.
4. Judy has contracted a local La Mesa caterer, Cupids, to supply 120 individually wrapped sandwiches, in a mix of Ham, Turkey and vegetable choices with condiments and a cookie for a cost of \$1.50 per sandwich. Scott made the motion that a \$40.00 tip be provided to bring the total cost to \$220.00. Judy seconded the motion, and it was unanimously passed. Debbie volunteered to pick up snacks and Scott will purchase bottled water/sodas.
5. Roberta received the award ribbons from Betty Fisher and Roz will send her a check.
6. Nancy Conney and Sheryl, from the Sky Hunters Group, will bring her owls to the Gallery during the reception for all to enjoy and admire. Roz will provide a donation check to Nancy's group as we have done in the past.
7. Scott provided Glenn Osga with the info needed to prepare and publish the online and printed version of the Show Program. Glenn will contact the College Printing to order 120 programs to have available at our show reception.

The next Foothills Board meeting will be held via Zoom on December 6th, 2021 at 10 am.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:35 am.

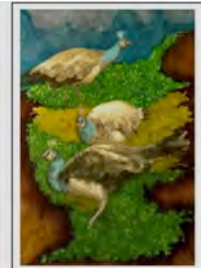
