## The Featured Artist for May is Glenda Richter

While Glenda taught in the English Department at Grossmont College, she began her study in art. Teachers include faculty at Grossmont and Cuyamaca Colleges, various teachers at the Atheneum, Grace Chow for Chinese Brush, and Cas Holmes, a British fabric artist who works with paper, fabric, found objects, and free-hand stitching. You will see Holmes's influence in Glenda's collage work.

When she discovered acrylics and the magic forgiveness of gesso, she worked mostly in acrylics. But her true interest is in collage — combining an Asian art aesthetic with her appreciation for texture and color and varied materials. Words are sometimes part of those varied materials. Although she retired from teaching writing, she has not been able to eliminate words entirely from her visual arts!

Glenda considers much of her work a personal history – a visual memory of important events and places in her life. Her art is grounded in rural Illinois where she grew up and spent time with her grandparents who saved everything. They saved bits of cloth for quilts or handbraided rungs. They saved seeds for next year's crop and garden. Now she saves everything – scraps from sewing projects, scraps from magazines, junk mail, advertisements. And she gives these scraps new life.

#### FOOTHILLS ART ASSOCIATION APRIL 2023 BOARD MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 12:00 April 3rd, 2023

Attendees: Peggy Connolly, Sharon Meng, Gary Dyak, Renee Cuifo, Barbara Drews, Bob Pinner and Bonnie Owen.

- 1. The minutes of the last board meeting were reviewed and approved.
- 2. Old Business: Sharon motioned that dues will be collected in June and there will be a prorated fee for members who join later in the year. Gary seconded the motion and the motion passed. Sharon will contact members who are delinquent for last year's membership dues.
- 3. With Bonnie Newsletter Editor, Renee Gallery Coordinator/Historian and Roberta LaBastida 2nd Vice President, not seeking re-election, we need to actively recruit members for these positions on the Board. The Board will review the descriptions of those positions.
- 4. Roz has noticed a rise in monthly operating fees. She suggested some options: raising the Membership fees to \$45.00 and increasing the art group donations to \$3.00. The groups will be given a chance to comment on the proposed increase in fees.
- 5. Gary presented potential judges for the Wildlife in Art Show. He will forward the judges websites to the Board to examine and choose the appropriate judge.
- 6. The Demonstration committee has made several suggestions to boost interest in workshops and increase revenue. The Gallery will reinstitute a request for the Demonstrating Artist to donate a piece of their artwork to be raffled off at the end of the monthly members meeting. Raffle off gift certificates, artsupplies and free registration to workshops. Limit workshops and promote them better, require a minimum of five paying members for a workshop. Another suggestion is to have an Annual silent auction and members could donate artwork for the auction.
- 7. The Demo committee has compiled a Foothills Member Survey to help improve our members' experience. The Survey will be sent out via email or mailed to members without access to email.

The meeting adjourned at 1:30

#### **Demonstrating Artist for May is RJ Pinner**

This event is about you as an artist and exploring your imaginative capacity in art. We will be making abstract drawings which can be taken home for refinement. Everyone has imagination and we will be helping you find that hidden talent. It's fun! It's spontaneous! If you're a beginner or an experienced abstracter you can't miss this event as there will be gems that emerge in the group process and from your interaction with other artists. Drawing materials will be supplied but you can bring your own dry media. A painting by the artist will be raffled off. A follow-up workshop on 27 May will expand your repertoire of techniques, explore more historic and academic principles, share the creative activity with your peers, and provide feedback on your work.

RJ Pinner has been painting for 12 years and a Foothills member since 2015. Like most of you he has developed skills from attending classes, visiting museums, watching Youtube, and generally exploring all there is about art.

Regarding art history, one finds the earliest art rife with symbolism relating to the natural and spiritual world. If you compare the earliest cave drawings with child drawings, there is a close resemblance. As humans became more clever, more organized, more centralized, art also evolved, first to capture the visual world more accurately, then to serve an educational purpose in a national society. Each technological discovery has brought forth new ways of mesmerizing people's vision. Any of the artistic media can be used for propaganda, for pleasure but also to express abstract and timeless realities.

Civilization has progressively subdued and extinguished the powers in nature, resulting in our safety, convenience and luxury. Each step from the smelting of bronze to the coding of software, directs the mind toward discrete controllable elements and away from a communion with all of nature and life itself. Thus I declare that art remains our connection to the source of life and attempts to express the often hidden meanings imbedded in our history and memory. Andrew Wyeth said, "your art is only as deep as your love." And what is more universal, more tantalizing, more mystifying, more confusing, more transcending than love.
