consists of twelve schools in the East County: Helix Charter, Steele Canyon, West Hills, IDEA, Monte Vista, Santana, Grossmont, Valhalla, Granite Hills, Mount Miguel, El Capitan and El Cajon Valley. All schools are participating in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Foothills Art Association Art Show.

GUHSD has been serving east San Diego County for more than 100 years. The twelve schools in the district represent the communities of: La Mesa, Rancho San Diego, Santee, Lakeside, Spring Valley, and El Cajon.

Four years ago Helix Charter High School was honored to partner with the Foothills Art Association (FAA) for the first time and had almost a hundred pieces of art displayed in their gallery. # DEMO & WORKSHOP ARTIST Andrea Priske Cowan



Andrea's background combines a formal education in fine art and a master degree in art and art therapy. In her work, she combines technical art skills alongside art therapy methods to explore identity and wellbeing.

She defines art therapy as using art materials to form images that can be reflective of how an individual thinks, feels, and acts in life. Art therapy activities give information about strengths and challenges and offer a starting point for exploring feelings and goals for personal growth. Creative projects are integrated with psychological theory and can have a positive impact on self worth and confidence.



#### MANDALA DEMO

#### Thursday, January 4, (after the members' meeting), **Foothills Fine Art Gallery**

Andrea will invite participants to create mandalas as an exercise to bring about discovery, focus, awareness and peace of mind.



Psychoanalysis, Carl Jung, a mandala-making pioneer, drew them for his own personal growth and also encouraged his clients to make them to assist with moving towards wholeness in mind and body.

As an art therapist, she uses mandalas to help clients contain difficult emotions. The process incorporates symmetry and flow alongside structure and flexibility. Members of a group can work on individual mandalas and then come together to discuss insights. The circle shape of a mandala offers a safe container to examine emotion, reactions and resiliency.



#### ROAD DRAWING WORKSHOP

#### Saturday, January 6, 10am-1pm, Foothills Fine Art Gallery

Andrea will lead the group in a road drawing activity, an ideal project for shaping personal and creative goals for 2024.

The road drawing is an art therapy method that can help people reflect on the metaphoric "roads" in their life and the drawings that develop often entail spontaneous imagery representative of a person's potential for change while emphasizing areas of conflict or importance over the course of their life.

Because roads are familiar to us, even people anxious about art making feel comfortable drawing them. Like a life map, road drawings offer clues about how experiences have impacted personal choices and decisions.

Andrea will guide and narrate the exercise and lead the group on a road drawing journey. Participants will be asked to quietly visualize their own road and then begin to draw what comes to mind.

# FOOTHILLS ART ASSOCIATION December 2023 Board Meeting Minutes


The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. on Monday, December 4, 2023.

Attendees: Peggy Connolly, Celeste Schwartz, Judy Sawyer, Barbara Drews, Dawn Ivy, Lorna Farmer, and Lloyd Smith

- 1. Peggy welcomed the group and provided a document with comments received regarding the Wildlife in Art Show/Reception. The group reviewed all of the comments and discussed best practices, goals for 2024, and ways to fine-tune the event. Ideas discussed included adding a fundraising chair to manage the fundraising efforts and a volunteer to manage the process of selling paintings, from start to finish.
- 2. Roz volunteered to manage the process of selling paintings at all future shows. The group discussed that sold artwork should be highlighted on the exhibitor list and a red dot sticker added to the artwork tag.
- 3. Peggy shared that we were able to purchase a new computer for the gallery and it is up and running.
- 4. Peggy also shared that we will be updating our website to make it more functional for our needs. The website will also undergo a redesign with a goal of having a consistent look on all of our communication platforms/pieces. Peggy asked for volunteers to join the team that will work on the website project.
- 5. The group discussed the cost to print and mail the newsletter to the members that do not have email and the cost to print newsletters for the gallery. The group agreed it was a needed expense and will continue with the current process.
- 6. The group discussed the approved themes for the 2024 Art Shows. The group decided to have a ballot box for members to vote for the artwork that best represents the theme of each show. The winning artwork will also serve as the future image for that show. The winner will receive a certificate and will also have the option to hang their winning artwork in the gallery for another month, labeled as the winner of the previous show's People's Choice Award. Lorna made a motion for the Board to approve the purchase of an acrylic ballot box for the People's Choice Voting, Judy seconded, all approved.
- 7. The new Art Show Themes will be published in the January Footnotes newsletter and a separate email will go out to membership as well. The themes were published in the December Footnotes and are posted in the gallery on the bulletin board.
- 8. Peggy made a motion for the Board to approve a \$100 budget to purchase refreshments for the Holiday Party, Judy seconded, all approved.
- 9. The group reviewed the Featured Artist process and the Program Chair will create a document to help keep featured artists informed of the process and opportunities.
- 10. Peggy stated that the updated bylaws and rules and regulations are still in the final review stages and Roz is working on creating an operating budget for 2024.
- 11. The group discussed the Featured Artists for 2024 and a process for notifying them of necessary dates and information.
- 12. The group reviewed the 2024 calendar and penciled in dates and times for all upcoming shows, meetings, and events. The secretary will compile all of the information and the Board will have final review before the dates are finalized.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:45 a.m.

The next Board Meeting will be held Monday, January 8, 2024 at 10:00 a.m.
