Paul White

VISIONS OF A COLOR BLIND ARTIST

Paul White was born in Detroit, Michigan, and the oldest of four children. His family moved around the country following his father's profession as a college football coach. Paul graduated from high school in Kalamazoo, Michigan where his father coached at Western Michigan University. He earned his BA in painting and later his MFA in painting and sculpture from Western Michigan University. He moved to San Diego in 1976 after earning his MFA and began his professional life as an artist/teacher/administrator.

He met his wife of 44 years where she taught middle school at a residential treatment facility treating severely emotionally disturbed adolescents. This began his journey in working with various disabled populations which included three years as director of Creativity Unlimited, an art studio working with disabled adults in San Jose, writing grants to the California Arts Council to serve as an artist in residence at various schools. He served as a costume and set designer for the San Diego Theater of the Disabled. After trying but failing to get an art center like Creativity Unlimited started here in San Diego, he moved on by starting his own business called After School Art, which he pursued until his retirement.

During all of this time he continued making his own art and exhibiting in shows and galleries here and in San Jose, Sedona, Santa Fe, and Taos. He fell in love with the desert after moving from the land of pine trees and lakes. His most recent works are paintings of the more than 100 cacti and succulents that he grows as well as various landscapes he has visited while 4WD camping in remote areas. He likes to work in a series explaining that he feels the need to explore an image/idea more thoroughly.

STUART BURTON BIO

Stuart Burton is a secondgeneration California native, and grew up in San Diego. Since obtaining his BA in Fine Art in Painting and Printmaking from San Diego State University, Stuart has devoted his life to the pursuit of making, promoting, and teaching art. Stuart has had more than 40 solo shows and his works have been included in more than 75 group exhibitions in California, Arizona and New Mexico.

Stuart has been using the landscape as his primary subject for exploring color, light, and texture in painting. His subjects range from the canyons, cliffs, and mesas of the Southwest to the flora and fauna of the coasts of Baja, to the mountains and streams of the California Sierras and the Colorado Rockies.

He currently holds memberships in the California Art Club, Oil Painters of America, the Impressionist Society of America, San Diego Museum of Art, and the Los Angeles County Museum of Art. A popular workshop instructor, he has conducted workshops all over San Diego County. His time is also in demand for demonstrations of his techniques in oil and acrylic painting, printmaking, and for his professional opinion as a juror.

An avid fan of the Southwest and the state of Baja California in Mexico, he is often on road trips to document the sights for future paintings. Stuart's paintings portray the natural land and coastal landscapes in their vivid intensity or subdued power.

Aside from painting, Stuart spends his time with wife, Kathy, their dogs, and cats at home in San Diego, and at the stables with their horses.





The meeting was called to order at 10:00am on Monday, January 8, 2024.

Attendees: Peggy Connolly, Celeste Schwartz, Judy Sawyer, Dawn Ivy, Lorna Farmer, Sharon Meng, Bob Pinner and John Engen

- 1. The group discussed the website and the time consuming process of including artwork online for every show. Several options were discussed, including utilizing social media and creating criteria for artists to submit artwork with the correct perimeters. The group also discussed including the featured artist's artwork and studio space images on the website. The website managers will bring recommendations to the next Board Meeting. The website will also undergo a redesign with a goal of having a consistent look on all of our communication platforms/pieces.
- 2. The group decided to create a committee to review the current Standing Rules for Exhibits. The committee members will include Sharon Meng, Barbara Drews, Lorna Farmer, and Toby Scriba. The committee will update the current document and present to the Board for approval. Sharon made a motion for the Board to approve the committee, Peggy seconded, all approved.
- 3. The group reviewed the 2024 Master Calendar and made some minor edits. The secretary will send the 2024 Master Calendar to the Committee Chairs for final review as well. Once the 2024 Master Calendar is finalized it will be emailed to our members.
- 4. The group discussed the new Ballot Box, the placement of the winning artwork, and the steps needed to manage it each month. Lorna volunteered to manage the monthly process.
- 5. The group also discussed touching up some chipping paint and the possibility of painting the display panels in the Gallery. John will work with Peggy on the touch up painting and will propose colors for the display panels to the Board.
- 6. The group discussed several volunteer roles and new opportunities for members. The roles and opportunities will be shared in the *Footnotes* newsletter.
- 7. The Featured Artist Program Chair shared a document she created to help keep Featured Artists informed of the process and opportunities. The jury process for the Featured Artist program was also discussed. The Featured Artist Program Chair stated that she utilizes the list provided to her from the Jury Committee.
- 8. Peggy stated that the bylaws, rules and regulations, and operating budget are still in process.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:45am
